THE RIBN PROGRAM

- Expands your career options with a BSN degree.
- Is an affordable four-year course of study.
- Offers concurrent admission and continued enrollment at a designated Community College and East Carolina University.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

- Four units of English
- Two units of social studies (one in U.S. history)
- Four units of mathematics (algebra I, algebra II, geometry, and an advanced unit of mathematics beyond algebra II)
- Three units of science (life science, physical science, and a laboratory course; biology and chemistry preferred)
- Two units of a language other than English

GRADE POINT AVERAGE

- To be eligible to apply for admission to the RIBN program, a student must have an unweighted cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale in the required high school courses.

HOW TO APPLY

1. Complete a free, online general application to the Community College on their admission page. Please be aware, this is not an application to ENC RIBN or to the Associate Degree or BSN nursing programs.
2. Submit your official high school transcript, all official college transcripts and official SAT, ACT or ATI TEAS Version 7 (see website for community colleges that accept ATI TEAS Version) scores to the Admissions Office at the community college by January 31.
3. Complete the ENC RIBN application online at <http://nursing.ecu.edu/bsn/ribn/apply>. You may submit unofficial documents (SAT, ACT, and ATI TEAS Version 7 and transcripts to the Student Success Advocate. These documents can be submitted to: ENCRIBN@ecu.edu.
4. Upon acceptance into the ENC RIBN program, the student must complete the ECU Admission online application and submit the required application fee by the published deadline. Submit your official high school transcript, all official college transcripts and official SAT or ACT, or ATI TEAS Version 7 scores to ECU Admissions.
5. Applicants with disabilities should contact the Coordinator of Disability Services/Counselor at the respective Community College.
