Are you interested in a lucrative career in welding? Certified welders are trained according to procedures and standards established by the American Welding Society (AWS) and work in the industrial, welding or agricultural industries. AWS certified welders are in high demand in these industries and are trained in shielded metal arc welding (SMAW), metal inert gas welding (MIG), plasma cutting and oxy-acetylene or oxy-fuel cutting.

The welding program at Roanoke-Chowan Community College prepares students with core skills needed to receive AWS certification. Students are trained and receive hands-on and real-world experience through available courses.

R-CCC welding students learn skills such as advanced SMAW, gas metal arc welding (GMAW), flux cored arc welding (FCAW), welding plates and pipes and receive instruction in beads, joint fit-up and alignment. The program begins with the basics and transitions into more advanced skills students need to become job ready. Welding tech students also learn metallurgy, weld symbols and how to read welding detail drawings.

Allied Healthcare



Community Health Worker

This course is designed to provide individuals with the required knowledge, tools, and resources to become recognized as a certified Community Health Worker (CHW) in North Carolina working in a variety of healthcare and community settings (health departments, hospitals, federally qualified health centers, clinics, faith-based organizations, etc. Instruction is designed to cover the nine core competencies which include communication, capacity building, service coordination, interpersonal, advocacy, outreach, personal/professional skills, health and social issues. Upon completion of this course, students will be eligible for listing as an NC Certified Community Health Worker. Hours: 102

Dietary Management – Hybrid

Two semester course, both semesters must be successfully completed to be eligible for the National Certified Dietary Management test. The two semesters include Food Safety Management and Nutrition and Medical Therapy. A variety of topics are covered in each semester including, food safety, meal preparation, supplemental feedings nourishment, management techniques, implementing dietary orders, and reviewing the medical records. Medication Aide

Course is designed to meet training requirement for becoming a medication Aide. The course covers the six rights of medication administration for non-licensed personnel. Topics include medication administration via oral, topical, instillation routes, medical asepsis, hand hygiene, and legal implications. Upon successful completion of the course student should be able to take the comprehensive competency test and qualify for listing on the North Carolina Medication Aide Registry. Hours: 24

Medical Assisting - Part I (HYBRID)

The Medical Assisting course prepares multi-skilled health care professionals qualified to perform administrative, clinical, and laboratory procedures. Course work includes instruction in scheduling appointments, coding and processing insurance accounts, billing, collections, computer operations; assisting with examinations/treatments, performing routine laboratory procedures, electrocardiography, supervised medication administration; and ethical/legal issues associated with patient care. *NOTE: Part II will be offered in Spring 2023. Pre-requisite: Successful completion of Part I.* Hours: 360

Nurse Aide I (Day and Evening) HYBRID

This course prepares graduates to provide personal care and perform basic nursing skills for the elderly and other adults. Topics include communication, safety, patient's rights, personal care, vital signs, elimination, nutrition, restorative care and rehabilitation in the long-term care setting. Upon successful completion of the course, the student is eligible to take the National Nurse Aide Assessment Test.

Upon successful completion, the student is eligible to apply for listing as a Nurse Aide II by the North Carolina Board of Nursing of the Nurse Aide II Registry.

Phlebotomy Training (Hybrid)

This course provides theory and clinical experiences needed for proper collection of blood and other specimens used in diagnostic testing. Topics include ethics, legalities, medical terminology, safety, infection control, patient relations, anatomy and physiology, and specimen collection. Upon completion, the student should be able to safely perform procedures necessary for specimen collection on patients in various health care settings. Upon successful completion of the theory and clinical experience, the student is eligible for the National Certification test (ASCP).

Advanced Manufacturing Institute

The coursework also includes teaching the proper health, safety, and sanitation procedures to avoid spreading infections. The students will be able to apply their skills to clients who visit the clinic. After successfully completing the course, the students will be able to sit for the North Carolina State Board of Cosmetic Art's exam to become a licensed Natural Hair Care Specialist.

Emergency Medical Technician – EMT (Initial)

This may include, but not be limited to, OEMS Education Institution approval, program director and instructor standards, classroom and distance education course approval, admissions requirements, course content, equipment standards, clinical and/or field requirements, and skills documentation. OEMS guidelines align with the rules of the NC Medical Care Commission and standards of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. For details, contact the Education and Credentialing Office of the NC Office of Emergency Medical Services, NC Department of Health and Human Services. This course will provide education enabling students to obtain their NC-EMT Certification.

For details, contact the Education and Credentialing Office of the NC Office of Emergency Medical Services, NC Department of Health and Human Services.

This course will provide education enabling students to obtain their NC-Paramedic Certification with the goal of preparing competent entry-level Paramedics in the cognitive, psychomotor, and affective learning domains. TIMS

This course is designed to establish the foundation for and promote consistent training of all responders to achieve the three objectives of the Traffic Incident Management (TIM) National Unified Goal: responder safety; safety, quick clearance from incidents; and prompt, reliable, interoperable communications. This course will familiarize fire and rescue personnel with the purpose of the Strategic Highway Research Program 2 (SHRP2) and National TIM Responder Training Program and how it relates specifically to North Carolina. Participants will learn to recognize and identify the dangers encountered by emergency responders working in or near traffic. This course is not a state fire & rescue certification course; however, it is a requirement related to one or more state certifications and will transfer electronically to the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for inclusion on OSFM transcripts. Please contact OSFM for details.

Creative and Liberal Arts



Basic Rider Course

This course is designed for new riders who have never ridden a motorcycle, and for re-entry riders who have not ridden in a long time. Even experienced riders who have taken this course have told us afterwards that they learned a lot. Persons interested in attending a BRC must be 16 years of age or older. Students under the age of 18 must have the written consent of a parent or guardian. You do not need to possess a driver's license or learners permit to take the course. However, you must be able to ride a bicycle, and you must possess some degree of strength. **THE COURSE IS PHYSICALLY DEMANDING!!** You should be able to support a 300-pound motorcycle while straddling it and can push the motorcycle for distances up to 120 feet. Heat and cold weather conditions can add to the strenuous conditions you'll encounter while taking the course. The Basic Rider Course is conducted at a pace that results in successful completion for most novice riders. However, if you experience significant difficulty or become a safety risk to yourself or others, you will not be permitted to continue to ride.

We provide the motorcycles. We recommend you bring your own DOT approved helmet, but our sites do have a limited supply of loaner helmets in the event you don't have your own. In addition, you will be required to wear eye protection, a long-sleeved shirt or jacket, long pants (preferably denim), over the ankle footwear and full fingered gloves (preferably leather). 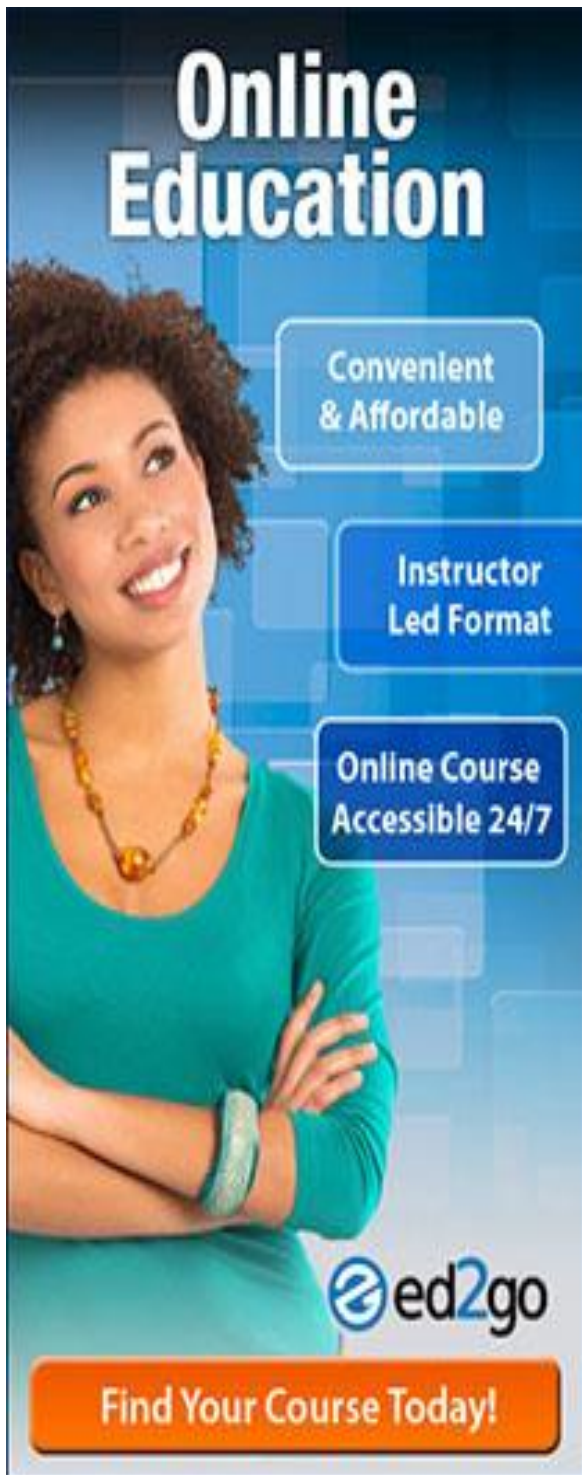

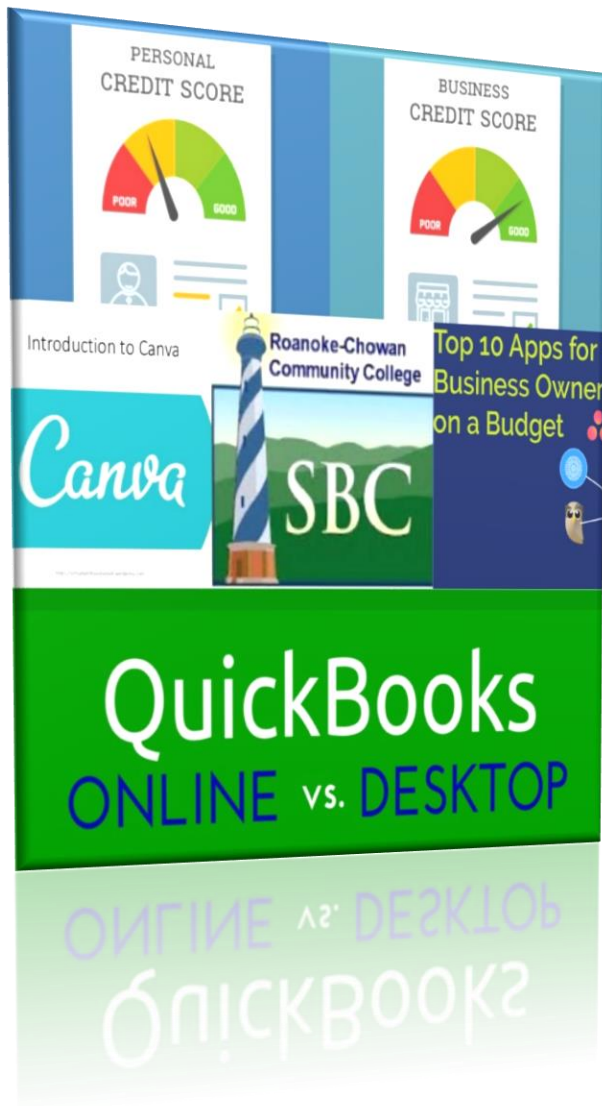
