NORTH CAROLINA LONGLEAF COMMITMENT GRANT (2021 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES) ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS (FOR FALL 2021-Spring 2023)

- Graduate from a North Carolina high school in 2021
- Be a North Carolina resident for tuition purposes
- Be a first-time college student [Career & College Promise (CCP) and Early/Middle College High School students are eligible]
- Enroll in a curriculum program during the 2021-22 academic year
- Enroll in at least 6 credit hours per semester
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for 2021-22.
- Have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) from \$0 \$15,000 ("EFC" is based upon a student's FAFSA determination)
- Renew the FAFSA for the 2022-23 academic years and meet the Satisfactory Academic Progress Requirements of the college

NEW AND RETURNING STUDENTS (CURRICULUM AND CONTINUING EDUCATION)

*Free tuition and college fees for NC residents for Fall 2021 and Spring 2022 only. This is a "last option" financial assistance program that provides tuition after all other federal and state funds have been applied. The college will utilize various funding sources: The North Carolina Longleaf Commitment, the American Rescue Plan, Pell Grants (Title IV funds), NC Works, State Employees Credit Union scholarships, Golden LEAF scholarships, GEER, and the R-CCC Foundation.) Students must enroll in 6+ hours of college credit classes or certification classes offered through the Division of Continuing Education that are 96+ hour programs leading to a state or industry recognized certification.
