

PELL Grant Lifetime Eligibility Used (LEU) Form 2020-2021

The Office of Student Financial Assistance has received information from the **National Student Loan Database** (**NSLDS**) that you are nearing or may have exceeded your lifetime aggregate limits for the Federal PELL grant. Beginning Fall 2012, new regulations took effect which limited the duration of a student's eligibility to receive this grant to a maximum of 12 Full Time semesters or that equivalent in PELL Grant monies, including all PELL payments received from all universities or colleges at any time since program inception. This is calculated as a 6 year award limit equating to 600% of PELL Grant Lifetime Eligibility Used (LEU).
